Chief responsibilities:

- Assessing and evaluating (with multidisciplinary team) each child's performance in all areas of development upon intake, including social-emotional and behavioral.
- Participating in the development of individualized goals for child and family.
- Providing evidence-based therapeutic interventions for children and families.
- Participating in coordination, information gathering, case presentation, and family assessment component of monthly FASD assessment and diagnostic clinic.
- Providing coaching and consultation for staff, parents and care providers.
- Attending or conducting conferences/consultations with caregivers, as needed.
- Participating as a member of a multidisciplinary team including caregivers and professional staff.
- Serving as a liaison with the medical and educational community on behalf of children and their parents.
- Demonstrating a caring, nonjudgmental, equity-minded approach to working with every family.
- Attending scheduled clinical and staff meetings and be an active participant in staff related activities.
- Preparing written reports and chart notes as required by Wonderland.
- Providing in-service trainings of staff and volunteers as needed.
- If qualified to do so, clinical supervision of agency mental health providers as needed.

Requirements/Qualifications:

- Interest in and passion for working with children with FASD and prenatal substance exposure!
- Master's degree with a valid license in the state of Washington; LMHC-A may be considered.
- Eligible to provide clinical supervision preferred, but not required.
- Commitment to building and strengthening equity practices.
- Bilingual preferred.
- Minimum one year of direct service experience with children and families, preferably providing trauma-informed care and working with families dealing with substance abuse and/or prenatal exposure.
- Prefer infant mental health, trauma-informed care, and motivational interviewing training/experience.
- Knowledge of parent/caregiver coaching; experience preferred.
- WA-AIMH endorsement preferred.
- Able to work at center, family home, and community settings.
- Current criminal background check maintained for all employees.
- Strong organizational skills.
- Excellent written and verbal communication abilities.
- Wonderland employees are mandated reporters of any suspected abuse or neglect of a child to DCYF (CPS) and/or law enforcement.

Wonderland was founded nearly 50 years ago by a group of dedicated parents and the Choshi Junior Women's Club to help just three children with developmental disabilities. In 2017 we served approximately 434 children ages birth to three with special needs and their families in north King and south Snohomish counties.
