Chief responsibilities:

- Participating as a member of a multidisciplinary team including caregivers and professional staff.
- Assessing needs of families and discussing services and supports available.
- Guiding families through program options and enrollment.
- Participating with therapy team in the development of individualized goals for child and family.
- Providing ongoing support, resources, and advocacy for families receiving services.
- Attending community meetings and/or appointments with family as appropriate.
- Connecting with schools to coordinate with, and advocate for, care and services.
- Modeling and teaching advocacy skills to families.
- Helping families understand and access public supports that may be available to them (DDA, SSI, etc.).
- Submitting and tracking requests for interpreters.
- Preparing agendas for weekly team meetings, attending, and providing summary notes following meetings.
- Providing information and resources to families and providers contacting the agency, as needed.
- Serving as a liaison with the medical and educational community on behalf of children and their parents.
- Demonstrating a caring, nonjudgmental, equity-minded approach to working with every family.

Skills and Qualifications:

- Interest in and passion for working with children with FASD and prenatal substance exposure!
- Minimum one year of direct service experience with children and families, preferably providing trauma-informed care and working with families dealing with substance abuse and/or prenatal exposure.
- Ability to establish and maintain effective working relationships throughout the agency and community.
- Commitment to building and strengthening equity practices.
- Bilingual preferred.
- BA preferred, but not required.
- Able to work at center, family home, and community settings.
- Current criminal background check maintained for all employees.
- Strong organizational skills.
- Demonstrated excellent written and verbal skills.
- Wonderland employees are mandated reporters of any suspected abuse or neglect of a child to either DSHS or law enforcement.

Wonderland was founded almost 50 years ago by a group of dedicated parents and the Choshi Junior Women's Club to help just three children with developmental disabilities. We currently serve approximately 250 children ages birth to three with special needs and their families per month in north King and south Snohomish counties. We are now expanding to serve children through age 12 and implementing a one-of-kind model of service delivery for children with prenatal exposure and their families.
