



Part or Full-Time Child & Family Therapist Hope RISING Clinic for Prenatal Substance Exposure

Join our growing clinic! Be part of a dynamic, multidisciplinary team providing evaluation and evidence-based therapeutic support for children birth through 12 years with prenatal substance exposure and their families. Our model, developed in consultation with the University of Washington's FASD clinic, provides cutting-edge services and is the first of its kind in the nation. **Extensive training and support provided.**

Chief responsibilities:

- Conducting child psychosocial assessments.
- Participating in the development of individualized goals and treatment plans for child and family.
- Providing evidence-based interventions (EBIs) for children with prenatal substance exposure and support for families. EBIs for this population are often more structured (some with curricula) than more traditional child therapy approaches. While relationship-building and emotional connection is at the core of all that we do, the primary focus of our direct interventions with children tends to be emotion regulation and executive functioning, and with parents/caregivers, psychoeducation. EBIs include Families Moving Forward (FMF), Good Buddies, Alert program, Parents and Children Together (PACT), and may include TF-CBT and Incredible Years.
- Approaching service delivery and support utilizing a neurobehavioral lens (brain-based disability where child "can't" rather than "won't"), of which accommodation is a key component (training provided).
- Provider must recognize the importance of working with children and caregivers to achieve the greatest impact and be comfortable providing support and services to both.
- Participating in coordination, information gathering, case presentation, and family assessment component of monthly FASD assessment and diagnostic clinic, as needed.
- Providing coaching and consultation for staff, parents, and care providers.
- Attending or conducting conferences/consultations with caregivers, as needed.
- Participating as a member of a transdisciplinary team including caregivers and professional staff from various disciplines.
- Serving as a liaison with the medical and educational community on behalf of children and their parents.
- Demonstrating a caring, nonjudgmental, equity-minded approach to working with every family.
- Attending scheduled clinical and staff meetings and be an active participant in staff related activities.
- Preparing written reports and chart notes as required by Wonderland.
- Providing in-service trainings of staff and volunteers as needed.
- Be committed to ongoing education and maintaining knowledge of current practices and research specific to this population.

Requirements/Qualifications:

- Interest in and passion for working with children with FASD and prenatal substance exposure!
- Master's degree in mental health field or social work with valid Washington State license.
- Fully licensed preferred; Associate license considered.
- Commitment to building and strengthening equity practices.

- Bilingual preferred.
- Minimum one year of direct service experience with children and families, preferably providing trauma-informed care and working with families dealing with substance abuse and/or prenatal exposure.
- Prefer child and family counseling, crisis work, trauma-informed care, and motivational interviewing training/experience.
- Knowledge of parent/caregiver coaching; experience preferred.
- Able to conduct therapy sessions via telehealth (training provided), in clinic setting, and in-home for up to 10% of caseload.
- Strong organizational skills.
- Excellent written and verbal communication abilities.
