



Pediatric Occupational Therapist **Hope RISING Clinic for Prenatal Substance Exposure**

Join our growing clinic! Be part of a dynamic, multidisciplinary team providing evaluation and evidence-based therapeutic support for children birth through 12 years with prenatal substance exposure and their families. Our model, developed in consultation with the University of Washington's FASD clinic, provides cutting-edge services and is the first of its kind in the nation. **Extensive training and support provided.**

Wonderland values diverse perspectives and life experiences and encourages people of all backgrounds to apply, including Black, Indigenous, and People of Color, immigrants, refugees, women, LGBTQ, people with disabilities, veterans, and those with lived experiences.

Chief responsibilities:

- Assessing and evaluating child's performance in the following areas of development: fine and gross motor, feeding, adaptive, behavioral, and sensory processing.
- Participating in the development of individualized goals for child and family.
- Providing evidence-based therapeutic interventions for children and families.
- Approaching service delivery and support utilizing a neurobehavioral lens (brain-based disability where child "can't" rather than "won't"), of which accommodation is a key component (training provided).
- Provider must recognize the importance of working with children and caregivers to achieve the greatest impact and be comfortable providing support and education to both.
- Participating in motor assessment component of monthly FASD assessment and diagnostic clinic. (optional)
- Providing coaching and consultation for staff, parents and care providers.
- Attending or conducting conferences/consultations with caregivers, as needed.
- Participating as a member of a transdisciplinary team including caregivers and professional staff from various disciplines.
- Serving as a liaison with the medical and educational community on behalf of children and their parents.
- Demonstrating a caring, nonjudgmental, equity-minded approach to working with every family.
- Attending scheduled clinical and staff meetings and be an active participant in staff related activities.
- Preparing written reports and chart notes as required.
- Providing in-service trainings of staff and volunteers as needed.

Requirements/Qualifications:

- Interest in and passion for working with children with FASD and prenatal substance exposure!
- Master's degree in occupational therapy with valid license in the state of Washington required.
- Commitment to building and strengthening equity practices.
- Bilingual preferred.
- One year of direct service experience with children and families preferred, ideally providing trauma-informed care and working with families dealing with substance abuse and/or prenatal exposure.
- A mental health lens and desire to work on emotional and arousal regulation.

- Prefer infant mental health, trauma-informed care and motivational interviewing training/experience.
- Knowledge of parent/caregiver coaching; experience preferred.
- Able to conduct therapy sessions via telehealth (training provided), in clinic setting, and community settings as needed.
- Strong organizational skills needed for maintaining documentation, meeting deadlines, and scheduling clients.
- Excellent written and verbal communication abilities.
